Reader: When we are tempted to judge the candidates by their behaviors and outward appearances, help us to remember that we were once the same age, and experienced many of the same feelings our youth are experienced right now.

Reader: When our groups seem to be storming, and working on our last ounce of patience, help us to remember the jello principle and go with the flow, remembering that soon they will be norming.

All: Jesus, who walked with the disciples on the road to Emmaus, we know that you walk with us please hear our prayers and remind us to walk with our own youth, break open the word with them, and break bread with them so that they in those experiences they may see You, Jesus.
